GHF and Francophonie (French-speaking)

Plenary sessions will be simultaneously translated to French and English. There will be at least one full series of parallel sessions in French, allowing the French-speaking audience to follow the conference from beginning to the end. All written and online materials will be available in French and English. The exhibition booths and demonstrations will also be bilingual.

Since its first edition, 10 years ago, the GHF has become a place for dialogue and major exchanges between field practitioners, the university hospitals, the public and private sectors, international organizations and the non-governmental organizations. Boasting an exceptional setting, Geneva is also one of the pillars of the Lemanic Arc, an intensive cultural, scientific and technological hub in terms of health innovation, also called the "Health Valley".

Innovative Solutions

Innovations have allowed a quantum leap in health over the last decades. Whether medical, pharmaceutical, biotechnology, genomics, computer, or non-technological, these medical advances are intended to provide solutions for patients who, only yesterday, were considered incurable.

But are these innovations really beneficial to mankind today? Because it is difficult to accept that only a part of mankind

has today access to health services, the globalised world innovates and unites to provide access to many of the major advances in health.

The GHF, faithful to its spirit, will in April 2016 offer the opportunity to have an open and constructive debate on innovation in healthcare, that is accessible to all and environment-friendly. The GHF 2016 will seek to be an influential voice on these issues, through the greatest experts in this field.

In view of the many challenges posed by the access to healthcare, it is important to provide innovative and affordable solutions. A multi-sector approach is needed to ensure access to new technologies and new medicines and to develop concrete and suitable solutions.

Geneva Health Forum 2016 hosting the World Health Summit

For its tenth anniversary in 2016, the GHF will host the World Health Summit (WHS) Regional Meeting in Geneva. This historic partnership between the two most dynamic events in Europe in terms of general health, seals a deep bond between the members of these international networks, but also a willingness to bring together the ideas, anal-

yses and recommendations on crucial issues for the health of humanity. Where health issues are at stake it was essential for the organisers of both events to combine their skills and share their ideas with the aim of developing a common voice and make recommendations on global health issues.

The World Health Summit (WHS) is the annual conference of the M8 Alliance of Academic Health Centers, Universities and National Academies. Its goal is to improve health worldwide through 1) collaboration, 2) open dialogue among all stakeholders and 3) agenda-setting through authoritative statements and calls for action strengthened by the InterAcademy Partnership (IAP) for Health.

The M8 Alliance is a unique network of 23 leading international academic health centers, universities and research institutions, including the InterAcademy Partnership (IAP) for Health, which represents more than 100 National Academies of science and medicine worldwide. The M8 Alliance acts as an academic think-tank for the WHS.

Main Features of the Geneva Health Forum

- ▶ Gives the floor to the stakeholders working in the field
- ▶ Promotes meetings between physicians and policy makers
- ▶ Favours debates and innovative solutions, if affordable and sustainable
- ▶ Promoting a multi-sectoral approach
- ▶ For the 2014 edition: nearly 400 submissions, 60 speakers, more than 170 oral presentations/speakers, 7 plenary meetings, 40 parallel sessions, 800 participants from around the world
